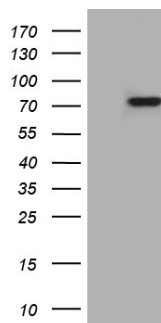

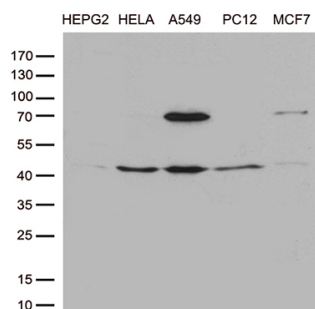

Immunogen	Human recombinant protein fragment corresponding to amino acids 1-275 of human PTCD3 (NP_060422) produced in E.coli.

Purification	Purified from mouse ascites fluids or tissue culture supernatant by affinity chromatography (protein A/G)

HEK293T cells were transfected with the pCMV6-ENTRY control (Left lane) or pCMV6-ENTRY PTCD3 (Right lane) cDNA for 48 hrs and lysed. Equivalent amounts of cell lysates (5 ug per lane) were separated by SDS-PAGE and immunoblotted with anti-PTCD3.
